

**Newspaper Decisions**

1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the publisher are considered wishing to continue their periodicals the publisher may continue to send them, unless the subscribers are otherwise advised.  
2. If subscribers order the discontinuance of their periodicals from the office to which they are addressed, the publisher will not be bound to settle their bills and ordered them discontinued.  
3. If subscribers move to other places without giving notice to the publisher, they are bound to the former direction they are held responsible.  
4. The courts have decided that "refusing to take periodicals from the office or removing and sending them to another place, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud."  
5. Any person who receives a newspaper and fails to pay for it, may be ordered it or not, is held in law to be a subscriber.  
6. If subscribers pay in advance they are bound to give notice to the publisher at the time taking it; otherwise the publisher is authorized to send it on and the subscribers will be responsible for the same, and the publisher will be entitled to full payment of all **plus** in sent to the publisher.
