

Newspaper Decisions.
1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary are considered as wishing to continue their subscription.
2. If subscribers order the discontinuance of their subscription the publisher may continue to send them until all arrearages are paid.

4. If subscribers order the discontinuance of their subscription the publisher may continue to send them until all arrearages are paid.
5. The courts have decided that "refusing to take periodicals from the office or removing and leaving them uncollected, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud."
6. Any person who receives a newspaper and makes use of it, whether he has ordered it or not, is held to be a subscriber.
7. If subscribers pay in advance they are bound to give notice to the publisher at the end of their term, if they do not wish to continue. If they otherwise the publisher is authorized to send it on and the subscribers will be responsible for it.
8. An express notice, with payment of all arrears, is sent to the publisher.
