

## Newspaper Decisions.

1. Subscribers who do not give express notice of the contrary are considered willing to continue their subscription.

2. If subscribers order the discontinuance of their subscription, the publishers may continue to send them until all arrears are paid.

3. If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their papers from the office to which they are directed, they are held responsible until they are discontinued.

4. If subscribers move to other places without informing the publishers, and the papers are sent in the same direction, they are held responsible for the cost of postage.

5. The courts have decided that "retailing to the public" from the office or removing and leaving them scattered for sale, is prima facie evidence of fraudulent intent.

6. Any person who receives a newspaper and makes use of it, whether he has ordered it or not, is held to be a subscriber.

7. If subscribers pay in advance they are bound to receive the papers until the end of their term, if they do not wish to continue taking it, they must give notice at the end of their term.

8. If subscribers are authorized to sell it, and the publisher is responsible for the sale, it is not the subscriber's responsibility to stop it.

9. If subscribers pay in advance of their term, and the publisher is responsible for the sale, it is not the subscriber's responsibility to stop it.
