Report of Prohibition Meeting.

Members of the Prohibition Central Committee, with other prohibitionists, pursuant to notice, met in the Court House, in Rensselaer, Dec. 20th, 1884. Being called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Sampson Erwin, D. T. Halstead was selected Secretary pro tem.

The Central Committee was reorganized by the election of the following committeemen, viz: Sylvester Omeara, C. D. Newels, A. G. W. Farmer, James Yeoman, sr., Henry Danner, G. Melendor, E. A. Pearson, Dan. vid Ralston and John B. Gray, from their several townships. The committee was empowered to select one from each of the remaining townships. James Yeoman was elected chairman, and G. D. Newels, secretary. The advisory committee from the W. C. U. T. heretofore selected, was ed.

A local Prohibition Club was organized for Rensselaer, of which any one may become a member by signing the preamble, constitution and by-laws. The preamble is as follows:

We, the undersigned, believing that the best interests of our country require the suppression of the liquor traffic in alcoholic drinks; that the time has come for earnest work with a view to secure the result, we hereby organize ourselves together for co-operative work under the following constitution:

(By article 1st, the name of the organization is the Prohibition Club, No. 1, of Rensselaer, Ind.)

D. T. Halstead was chosen temporary chairman to call a meeting of the Club some time in the near future, when a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer will be elected, as by the constitution provided.

On motion of Hon. R. S. Dwiggin, the Secretary was required to furnish a report of proceedings for the DEMOCRATIC SENTINEL, Rensselaer Republican and Monitor Journal.
