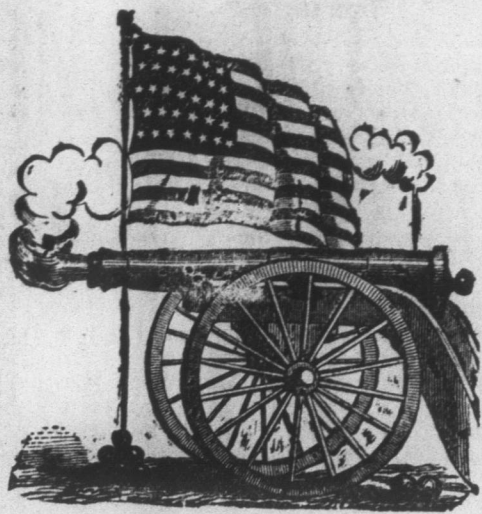
Anderson, one of the Returning Board Rascals—relic of the Louisiana villainy of '76—has just been bounced out of a \$3,000 position by this administration. Just now, however, the Republicans are being frightfully gored, and our neighbor George, of the Rensselaer Republican, hastens to denounce as a "demoralizing and disgraceful doctrine in politics" that "To the victors belong the spoils." To test his sincerity in this direction, we suggest to Sheriff Yeoman, Auditor Robinson, Clerk Irwin, and the other officers that they divide the spoils (legal ads) under their control equally between the Sentinel and the Republican, or, what would be better still for interested parties, have all such publications made in the two papers, and divide equally the fees.
