COEN.—Died Saturday morning, Dec. 12, 1885, was born in Lancaster county, Penn., December 16, 1836, and died in Jasper county, Ind., Dec. 12, 1885, at the age of 48 years 11 months and 27 days. Her maiden name was Hosler. Her parents removed from Pennsylvania when she was about three years old, and settled in Fountain county, Indiana. She was married to William S. Coen, March 15, 1854, and they removed to Jasper county in November, 1866. To this union have been born ten children—six sons and four daughters—nine of whom survive her.

She united with the Presbyterian church at Robroy Fountain county, Ind., at about the age of fifteen.
