The first installment, including all Road Taxes, is payable on or before the Third Monday in April, 1887, and the second installment on or before the First Monday in November, 1887. If the first installment is not paid when due, then both installments become delinquent, and ten per cent. penalty will be added to the full amount.

ALL ROAD TAXES

Must be paid in first installment. The Treasurer is responsible for the taxes he could have collected. Therefore, Tax-Payers should remember that their taxes MUST be paid every year. No County Order will be paid to any person owing delinquent taxes. The sale of lands for delinquent taxes begins on the Second Monday in February, 1887.

For the collection of which I may be found at my office in Rensselaer, Jasper County, Indiana, as directed by law.


