

NOTICE is hereby given to all the citizens of the Town of Rensselaer, and District number one in said Town, and Marion Township, in the County of Jasper, and State of Indiana, that I, the undersigned John G. Reynolds, a male inhabitant of the State of Indiana, and a man of good moral character, and not in the habit of becoming intoxicated, and a fit person in every respect to be intrusted with the sale of Intoxicating Liquors, will make application for a License to sell and barter in less quantities than a quart at a time. I will not sell or barter any other intoxicating liquors which may be used as a beverage, with the privilege of permitting the same to be drunk in and upon the premises where sold and bartered, at the regular September session of the Board of Commissioners of Jasper County, Indiana, to be held in the Town of Rensselaer, Jasper County, Indiana, and running thence in a southerly direction along the eastern line of Front street in said Town a distance of one hundred and seventy-one (171) feet and three (3) inches, and from thence westerly on a line parallel with Washington street in said Town fifty (50) feet to a point on the westerly line of Front street, in said Town, to the southeasterly corner of the premises whereon said liquors are to be sold. Thence westerly on a line parallel with Washington street, in said Town, fifty (50) feet, thence northerly on a line parallel with Front street, in said Town, nineteen (19) feet and eight (8) inches, thence easterly on a line parallel with Washington street, in said Town, fifty (50) feet, thence southerly on the westerly line of Front street, in said Town, nineteen (19) feet and eight (8) inches to the place of beginning. 


