The Board of Directors of the Jasper County Agricultural Society reserve the right of absolute and full control of their time track; the races made thereon; and to punish as they shall deem proper any and all misbehavior of owners, riders and drivers of competing animals which may be brought to their notice.

National Rules govern trating and pacing trials; Lexington Rules govern running trials, except where they conflict with the rules of the Society.

The horse distancing the field shall only be entitled to first money.


