**How to Kill Trees.**  
 Answering an inquiry as to how trees may be killed, one correspondent recommends muriatic acid, saying that it was used by a telegraph company to kill trees that were in the way of their lines. Another reader recommends boring a hole at the base of the tree and filling with crude kerosene. Some leaves must be tacked over the hole to keep out the rain. This he asserts will kill tree and roots so that there will be no sprouting. Another replies thus: "Bore small holes and apply a few drops of pure carbolic acid."
