NOTICE is hereby given to all the citizens of the Town of Remington and Carpenter Township, in the County of Jasper, State of Indiana: That I, the undersigned Daniel O'Connor, a white male inhabitant of the State of Indiana, and over the age of twenty-one years will make application to the Board of Commissioners of the said Jasper county, in the State of Indiana, and at the next regular session and meeting of said Board of Commissioners to be held in the Town of Rensselaer, in said Jasper county, commencing on Monday, the 2d day of June, 1890, for a License to sell Spirituous Liquors—Wine, Malt Liquors, and all Intoxicating Liquors which may be used, in less quantities than a quart at a time, with the privilege of allowing and permitting said Liquors to be drunk on the premises where said, and precisely located and described as follows, to-wit: "A one-story Frame Building located upon Lot number one (1) of P.
