Laws of Newspapers.

Except at the option of the publisher, no paper will be discontinued until all arrears are paid.

Any person who receives or takes a newspaper from a post office, whether he has ordered it or not, or whether it is in his name or another's, is not entitled to be a subscriber and is subject to a fine.

If subscriber moves to other places without notifying the publisher, and the papers are sent to the former direction, they are held responsible.

The courts have decided that subscribers, in arrears, who refuse to take papers from the office, or returning any less than the amount due, for the purpose of avoidance of payment of the same, may be liable in the criminal courts.

If any person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrears or the price which may continue to send it. If this is not made and collected, the amount whether the paper is taken from the office or not, there can be no legal discontinuance until payment is made in full.
