Church History.

In this article I shall speak of those persons who composed the church at its organization.

James Van Rensselaer was a native of the state of New York, and according to the record on his monument in the church yard at Rensselaer, he came with his family to this county in 1837, bought land and laid out the town of Rensselaer, naming it after himself, leaving off the 'Van' and emphasizing the first syllable. He built a grist-mill and sawmill, and not long afterward erected a frame residence. It stood where Geo. K. Hollingsworth is now building his handsome residence. He died March 12, 1847, and soon after his widow and daughter (Mrs. Westo.) and family went back to New York. They were a good family and very highly esteemed by all who knew them.

Ezra Wright and Martha, his wife, were natives of Pennsylvania, and came here about the year 1846 and settled on the land now owned and occupied by Mr. W. S. Coen and Mrs. Churchill. He and his wife were prominent in the organization of the church here. They were both good, active, energetic Christian workers. He was a man of more than ordinary ability and strict integrity; quick to see what ought to be done and ready to do it. He was the main pillar in the church for about 20 years. He left here with his family soon after the civil war closed, went to Richview, Ill., and died there a few years ago leaving wife and two daughters, who, so far as I know are still living. est daughter in Topeka, Kansas. Ira Allen and his wife left here in the fall of 1851 and went to Wisconsin, where they died severally a year ago.

Henry Barkley was a native of Ireland, first located in Pennsylvania; came to this county in 1837 and settled in what is now Barkley township. The township was named for him, he being an old settler and a prominent man in the community. He was an Irish Presbyterian of the true blue kind, had been an elder in the church where he came from, was one of the first elected in this church, and served faithfully until God called him to his reward. He lived to 1857, leaving a widow and nine children. Six of them are still living, some of whom are members of the Presbyterian church.

Lucia da Mahaffie, when the church was organized, lived with her husband on the farm now owned by J. C. Porter, of this place. The sold their farm and went to Kansas about the year 1854 where they are living—or were a short time ago.

I should have stated above that Ezra Wright and Ira Allen were both elders in the church.

After a lapse of 44 years we note there are but two or three of the original members now living.
