To County Health Officers:

You are hereby instructed to cause all property owners, in your jurisdiction, to remove from their premises all garbage, waste or other matter which may prove detrimental to the public health, or in any manner interfere with the comfort of the people. Please to communicate this order to all town and city health officers, with instructions to enforce the same within the limits of their respective municipalities, and give publicity to it through your newspapers. The provisions of this order should be complied with, by May 15, 1892.
