#### DEMOCRATIC COUNTY CONVENTION.

Pursuant to call the Democratic County Convention met at the court house, Rensselaer, Wednesday afternoon, Sept. 6th, 1894, and was called to order by N. S. Bates, chairman of county committee, when, on motion, Mr. Bates was elected chairman, and Jas. W. McEwen secretary of the convention.

The matter of candidates having been fully canvassed before the meeting of the convention, business was proceeded with accordingly. For Commissioner, 3d district, the nomination of Ed. W. Oulph, of Carpenter township, was made by acclamation.

The following resolution, offered by James W. Douthit, was then unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That this convention hereby place in nomination the remaining respective candidates for the respective county offices that were nominated by the People's party at their last county convention to be voted for next November, and that the chairman and secretary certify the same according to law.

On motion, adjourned.
