NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LICENSE.

NOTICE is hereby given to the citizens of the Town of Remington and of Carpenter township,十二 county, State of Indiana, that the undersigned, Jasper M. Baker, of Remington, Indiana, a male inhabitant of the State of Indiana, and over the age of twenty-one years, is of good moral character, not in the habit of becoming intoxicated, and a fit person in all respects to be entrusted with the sale of intoxicating liquors; that this applicant is a citizen of the said town for over ninety days past and that it is applied for by the actual owner and proprietor of said business herein mentioned, and will be granted for the entire term of such license, if license be granted, will apply to the Board of Commissioners of Jasper county, Indiana, at their June Term, 1897, for a license to sell and barter in all other intoxicating liquors in a quantity not less than a quart at a time, with the privilege of allowing and permitting the same to be drunk on the following premises, to-wit:

The precise location of the premises on which the undersigned desires to sell and barter with the privilege of allowing and permitting the same to be drunk thereon is the lower floor of a two story frame metal covered building located on Lot numbered six [6], in block numbered eight [8], in the original plot of the Town of Remington, Indiana, and the man in said building in which he desires to sell is specifically by outside measurement described as follows:

Commencing twenty-five (25) feet west of the south-east corner of said lot numbered six [6], in block number eight [8], in said original plot of the Town of Remington, Indiana, and running thence north fifty (50) feet and four (4) inches, the same west twenty (20) feet and two (2) inches, thence south fifty (50) feet and four (4) inches, and thence east twenty (20) feet and two (2) inches to the place of beginning; and interior ceiling eleven feet high.

That the said described room is separate from any other business of any kind, and that no device for amusement or music of any kind or character is in said room and that there is no partition or partitions in said room; that said room can be securely closed and locked and administered to; that said room is situated on the ground floor in said building on said street and fronts on the south, facing a Railroad and Railroad street, being a public street between said railroad and said block in said town. The said room is so arranged with glass windows and glass doors so that the whole of said room may be viewed from the said street.
