Written permission will be given to pupils who may be better accommodated by a change from the above. But in no case will pupils be allowed to take more than one examination.

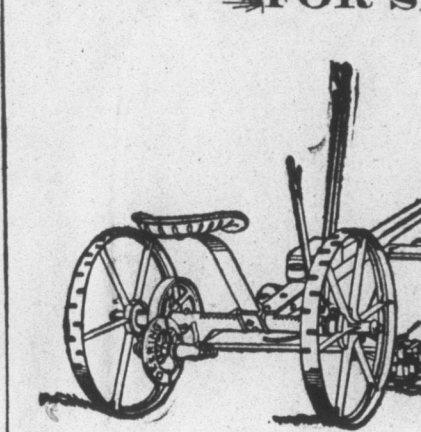

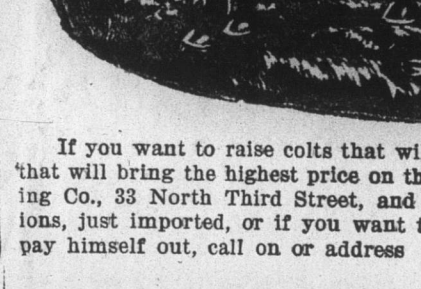
