All Seventh Year Pupils should take the examination in Geography this year. All such pupils will have a grade of 75 per cent or over will have their grades recorded, and will be excused from examination in this subject when they apply for a diploma next year.

Scientific Temperance questions will be given in connection with the Physiology.

Written permission will be given to pupils who may be better accommodated by a change from the above. But in no case will pupils be allowed to take more than one examination.
