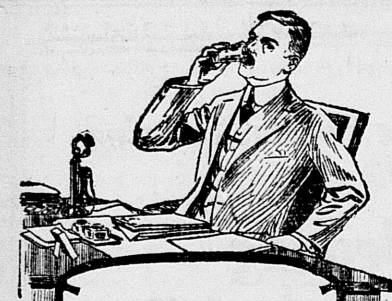
Utilities Commission Will Not Order Reopening of Street.

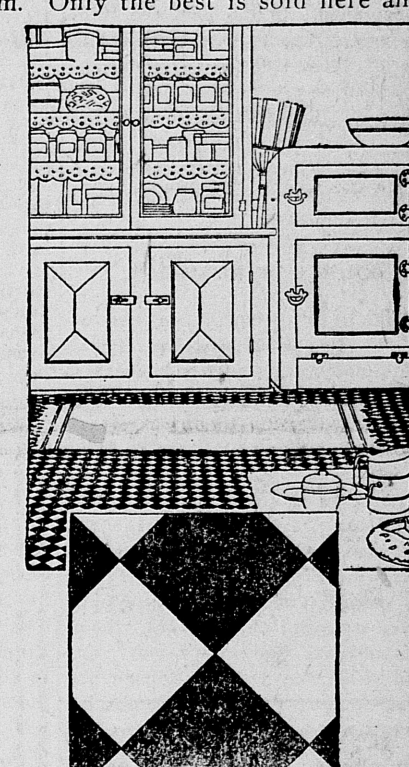
