On March 3rd, 1887, she was united in marriage with Elts Tobin.

To this union four sons and one daughter were born.

Eight years ago Mrs. Tobin moved with her family to Jordan township, Jasper county, Indiana, where they lived on a farm.

Shortly before their marriage she with her husband, united with the German Methodist Episcopal church at Melvin, Ill., of which she remained a faithful member.

She will be greatly missed in the community in which she spent the latter part of her life.

She leaves to look forward to the meeting over there, the faithful husband, four sons, John H. of Melvin, Ill.; Henry B. and Louis S. of Jordan township and Albert L. of Rensselaer; a daughter, Catherine E., who is at home, four grand children, two brothers in this country, John Weber of Beatrice, Nebraska, and Louis Weber of Melvin, Ill., also two sisters and a brother in Germany and a host of friends.

Funeral services were held at the Trinity M. E. church in this city Wednesday afternoon and interment was made in Weston cemetery. The Rev. E. W. Strecker was in charge and was assisted by the Rev. H. Stahmer of Melvin, Ill.
