The city council met in regular session Monday evening with all members present. The session was a quiet one, little business of importance being transacted.

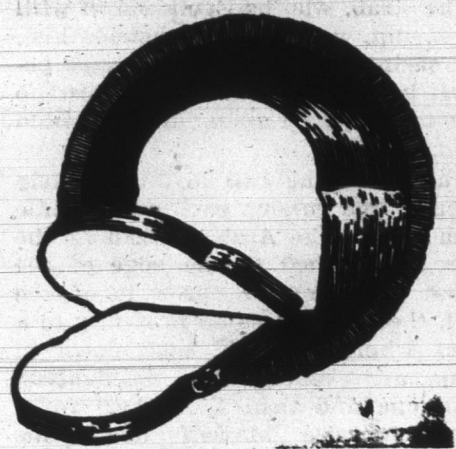

The report of the finance committee was approved and warrants were ordered drawn for the amounts named.



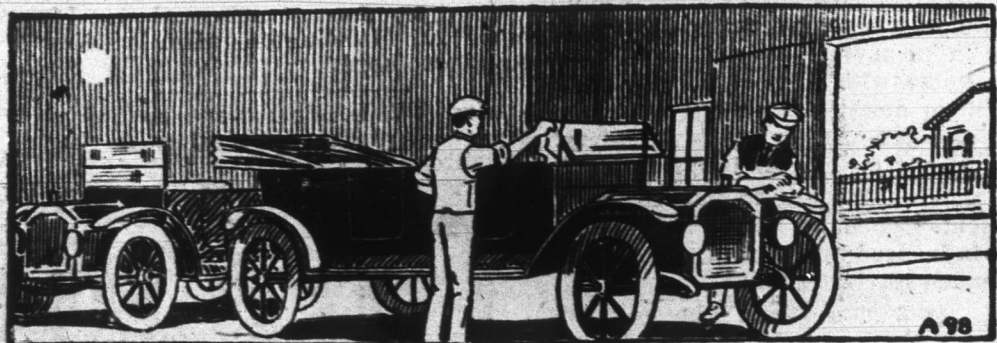
