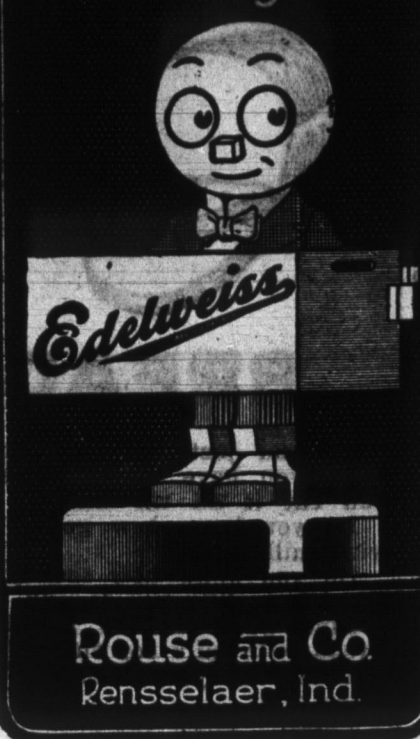

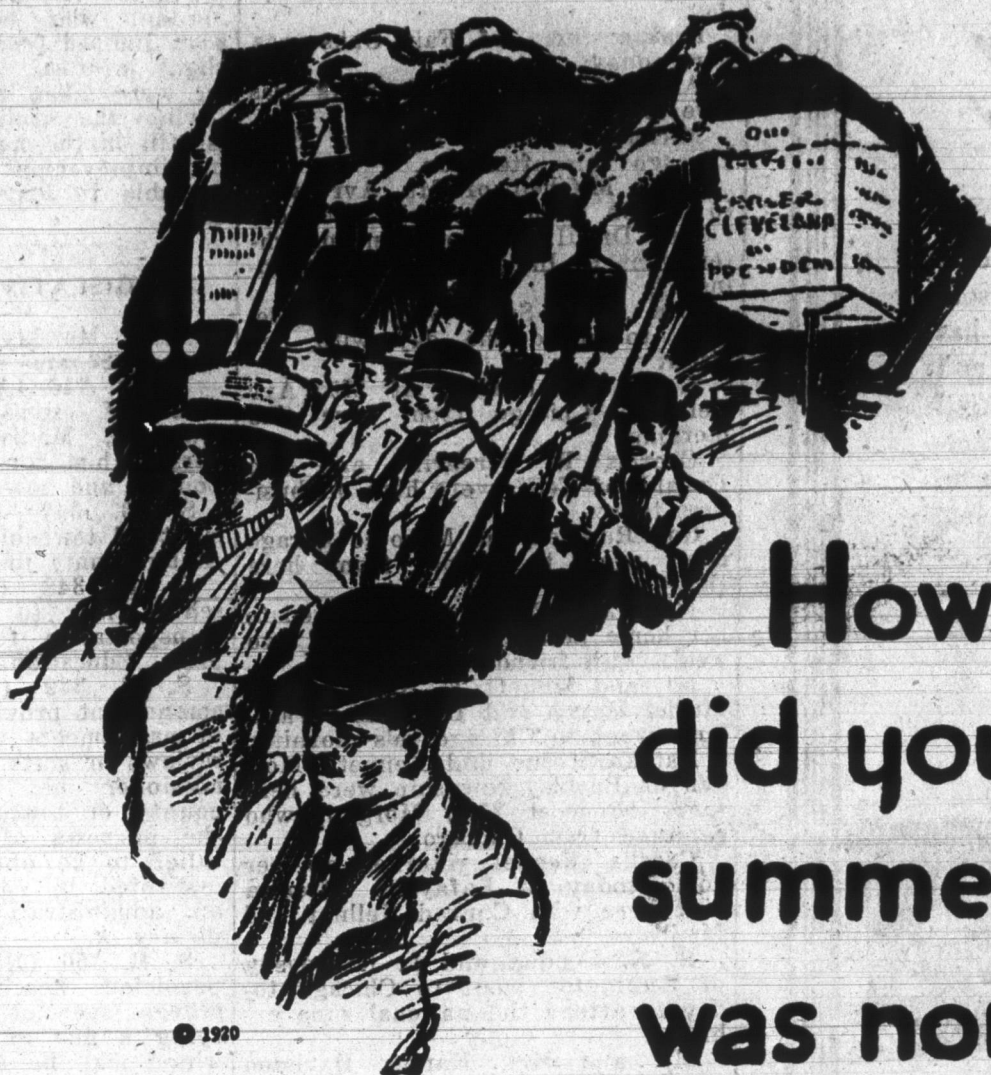
WEDNESDAY, JULY 14

## NOTICE OF ROAD PETITION.

Notice is hereby given by the undersigned, Auditor of Jasper County, Indiana, that a petition has been filed in the office of the Auditor of Jasper County, Indiana, reading as follows:

State of Indiana, County of Jasper,

In Commissioner's Court, July Term, 1920.

In the matter of the petition of Jesse G. Eldridge for an improved highway in Barkley Township, Jasper County, Indiana.

We, the undersigned, freeholders and voters of Barkley Township, Jasper County, Indiana, respectfully petition your Honorable Board, and we ask that Barkley Township in said Jasper County, Indiana, may be improved by grading, draining and paving the same with crushed stone or gravel, or other suitable material, said highway being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of Section Eleven (11), in Township twenty-nine (29) North, Range six (6) West, in Barkley Township, Jasper County, Indiana, and running thence west along the present existing public highway to the Southwest corner of the East three-fourths of the Southeast Quarter of Section nine (9), Township twenty-nine (29) North, Range six (6) West, in Barkley Township, Jasper County, Indiana, also commencing at the Northeast corner of the Northwest Quarter of Section fifteen (15), in Township twenty-nine (29) North, Range six (6) West, in Barkley Township, Jasper County, Indiana, on the east and west portions of the proposed improvement and running thence south along the present existing highway a distance of one mile to the Township line dividing said Barkley Township and Marion Township in said County and State.

That said proposed improvement will connect at the East and West ends thereof with an already improved free gravel or macadamized road or highway, and at the south end thereof with the Township line dividing Barkley and Marion Townships; and that when constructed, said improvement will be and constitute one continuous line of improved highway with a total length of approximately two and seven-eighths miles.

That these petitioners further repre-

sent that said highway should be improved by grading, draining and paving the same with crushed stone, gravel or other suitable road-paving material; that said highway should be improved to a width of 40 feet, and the grade thereof should be of the width of 24 feet, and that upon said grade there should be placed crushed stone, gravel or other suitable road-paving material to the width of twelve (12) feet and to the depth of twelve (12) inches.

That these petitioners further say that the improvement of the said above described line of highway petitioned for herein will as they believe be of great benefit and utility, and that the benefits to be derived therefrom will greatly exceed the costs and expenses of locating and constructing the same.

WHEREFORE, Your petitioners pray that this, their petition, be heard and spread of record; that an engineer and viewers be appointed and directed to view the line of the proposed improvement and make and file their report thereon, and that such other and further proceedings be had as the law provides.

JESSE G. ELDRIDGE, ET AL., of the Board of Commissioners of Jasper County, Indiana, as shown by the endorsement of the Auditor of said Jasper County, Indiana, upon said petition.
