THEODORE, JR., AGAINST LEAGUE

Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 6.—Lieut. Col. Theodore Roosevelt and Raymond Robins, of Chicago, addressing a mass meeting of republican women here today, assailed the league of nations as a menace to American nationality and criticized the democratic national administration for alleged extravagance and blundering.

Declaring that the administration had been extravagantly wasteful and inefficient in its conduct of many government departments, Lieut. Col. Roosevelt said that the calibre of the cabinet members selected by President Wilson made efficient administration difficult. Secretary Daniels, Secretary Baker

and Postmaster General Burleson were criticized by the speaker.

Allied intervention in Russia and Siberia was the result of an attempt to collect debts owed by the czar's government to international bankers. Raymond Robins, who was a member of the American commission to Russia, declared.
