Racing at Indianapolis This Year.

The Indianapolis Driving Club will give two race meetings this year. The first will be running races for the last week in May, at which \$10,000 will be distributed. The other will be the trotting and pacing races, August 17 to 22, inclusive, where \$40,000 will be hung up. Indianapolis is now in the running circuit composed of Terre Haute, Columbus, O., Saginaw and Elkhart. In trotting and pacing she is a member of the Grand circuit, composed of Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland and Ft. Wayne. There will be no better racing in the United States.
