



THE PLAYING OF THE SECOND All-Star Baseball game in Chicago Monday, left just a little to be desired to some extent. With the big run of Sunday doubleheaders and the intensity of the pennant races also coupled with the fact that no extra time is allotted for this game, many of the pitchers one would expect to see in a game of stars couldn't pitch Monday.

IT WAS EXPECTED SEVERAL days prior that Don Drysdale and Jim Bunning would again be the starting pitchers. Drysdale has won 19 games and is the top pitcher in the majors so far this year. However, he went nine innings Sunday against the Giants, the team the Dodgers are most concerned about at the present time.

BUNNING, WHO WAS DESIRED mainly because of his tremendous success against right handed batters and the National League consisted of all right handers except the pitcher, also worked Sunday for the Tigers. Then the choices went to the old veteran Warren Spahn for the Nationals and Camillo Pascual for the American League. But at the last minute, both of these two had minor aches and pains in their arms to eliminate them as no manager is going to risk a star for such a game.

MICKEY MANTLE, THE BIG gun of the New York Yankees also missed the game as he was bothered with knee trouble Sunday again, but not as serious as before. However, Rocky Colavito, Mantle's replacement, was one of the stars of the game as he drove in four runs in the American League's 9-1 win. This broke a streak for the American League as they had not won in the last six contests and have in the past few years watched a 12 game advantage slip away to one prior to yesterday's game.

THE NATIONAL LEAGUE had a brief lead, but the American League came back with the home run punch to control the battle Monday. There were some sparkling fielding plays as well by both sides, but a couple of fine plays by the American Leaguers that helped them stay out of trouble. However, one thing should have satisfied the fans, that of seeing most of the players available. In recent games, the managers have run them in and out on a wholesale basis. Yesterday was not much different, except for three men who played the entire game for the American League those being Maris, Colavito and Gentile, the three, four and five hitters. It always appeared from here that if you are playing to win, use your best and if these three are good enough to bat right in the middle of the order, then they are the best you have.

HOWEVER, IN THE NATIONAL league, Willie Mays was taken out after a few innings and he is one of the best performers the All Star games have ever seen. He seems to produce that something extra in these mid-summer classics. One thing happened Monday that had to bring a little chuckle from the fans, that concerning a pitcher hitting. Hank Aguirre, who is definitely in the running for the worst hitter in baseball, batted twice in the game as his turn came up twice while he was pitching. Usually most pitchers don't even get to hit, or at least not over once, but here the weak

stick of Aguirre was called on twice. However, the runs were not extremely needed when he came up and also manager Ralph Houk didn't want to dip further into his pitching corps at that time.

AFTER PITCHING HAD been a very dominant factor in the past years, the hitting was almost a welcome sight. It remains to be seen whether two games will be played next year or one. Many feel that one will be, but the players again voted for the two contests as they like that extra money going into the pension fund. This fund lacks a little of what they desire in it and this is a great boost each year. So, don't be surprised if again next year two dates are set for the All-Star games and the continuance of the present set-up prevails.

## To Discuss The Season For White Tailed Deer

The Division of Fish and Game of the Indiana Department of Conservation stated today that there will be a public hearing on Monday, August 6, 1962, for the purpose of discussing the open hunting seasons on white-tailed deer. This hearing will be held in Room 602, State Office Building, Indianapolis, Indiana, at 10 a.m.

The proposals to be presented are based on recommendations of wildlife biologists of the Department of Conservation.

1) Archers will be permitted to take a white-tailed deer during the period from November 1 through December 1, 1962, both dates inclusive. From November 1 through the 21st, archers will be permitted to take one deer of either sex or of any age. During the period of November 22 thru December 1, archers will be permitted only one male (buck) deer which must have at least one forked antler. It is to be proposed, however, that for the dates of November 22, 23 and 24, one deer of either sex and of any age may be taken within the area surrounding the Crane Naval Ammunition Depot. The exact boundaries of this area are the Depot property line on the inside and state roads 45, 58, 37 and 450 and U. S. Highway 50 on the outside.

white-tailed deer shall extend from November 22, through December 1, 1962, both dates inclusive. These hunters will be permitted one male (buck) deer with at least one forked antler. On November 22, 23 and 24, in the immediate area surrounding the Crane Naval Ammunition Depot, one deer of either sex may be taken. Boundaries of this special area are indicated above.

3) A special hunt is being proposed for the Crane Naval Ammunition Depot and Camp Atterbury for November 22, 23 and 24. At CNAD, hunters will be permitted two deer of either sex and of any age, but will be required to purchase a special license in addition to the regular deer license. The Camp Atterbury hunters will be permitted only one deer of either sex and of any age. Other details of these special hunts will be discussed during the hearing.

4) It will also be proposed to permit the taking of one deer of either sex and of any age within the boundaries of Jefferson Proving Ground during the entire season recommended for gun hunters.

## Propose Change For Hunting Fur Bearers

The Division of Fish and Game of the Indiana Department of Conservation has announced that there will be a hearing on August 6, 1962, for the purpose of changing regulations governing certain fur-bearing animals. This hearing will be held in Room 602 of the State Office Building, Indianapolis, at 10:00 a.m.

The proposed changes concern the length of season for the taking of fur bearing animals, as well as the running of these animals with dogs.

The recommendation for the taking of fur-bearing animals will be to shorten the present season by 15 days. As the law now stands, the season ends on February 15. There is some consideration being given to opening the season on November 1, which would be 15 days earlier than last year.

The proposed season for running fur-bearing animals with dogs will extend from noon September 1, 1962, through noon January 31, 1963 and from noon February 15, 1963, to noon April 15, 1963, all dates inclusive.

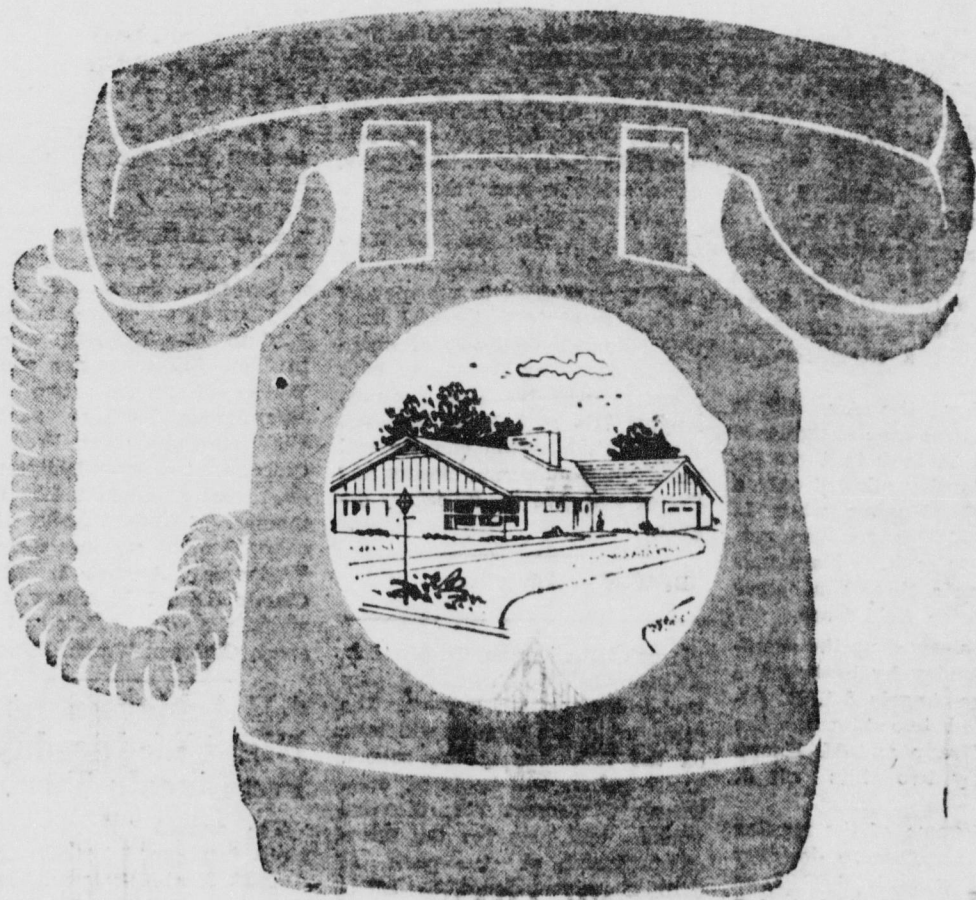
