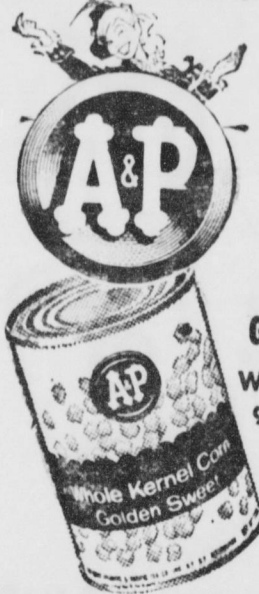
Joseph Burkus Jr., North Liberty, was the best man. Ushers were Brian Headman and Charles Gerdt, the latter of Indianapolis.
