## Salmon Fishermen May Also Land Trout

Fishermen try to get their luck this spring for salmon in the Indiana waters of Lake Michigan are reminded by the Indiana Department of Natural Resources that they have a one-in-ten chance of landing a trout as well.

Reports this week from biologists of the Indiana Division of Fish and Game indicate that the salmon and trout have moved into the south end of Lake Michigan. They are not taking the baits of the sport fishermen with much enthusiasm as yet but should start biting as soon as the ice clears out.

Very few fishermen can distinguish between a salmon and a trout, the Department points out, so it would be wise to purchase a trout stamp and stick it to your fishing license before you board your boat in Lake Michigan. Present law requires a \$2 trout stamp affixed to an Indiana fishing license when taking trout from Indiana waters. The stamp is not needed to catch coho or chinook, which are not trout but are members of the salmon family. Trout stamps can be purchased from County Clerks and other authorized license agents.

John Eckert, chairman of the event for the sponsoring Plymouth Jaycees, reported that the organizational meeting for the

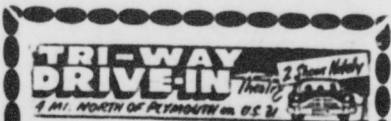
event took place March 30th. Eckert also said that more than 15-Hundred Scouts in 47 Scout units will participate in this year's event.

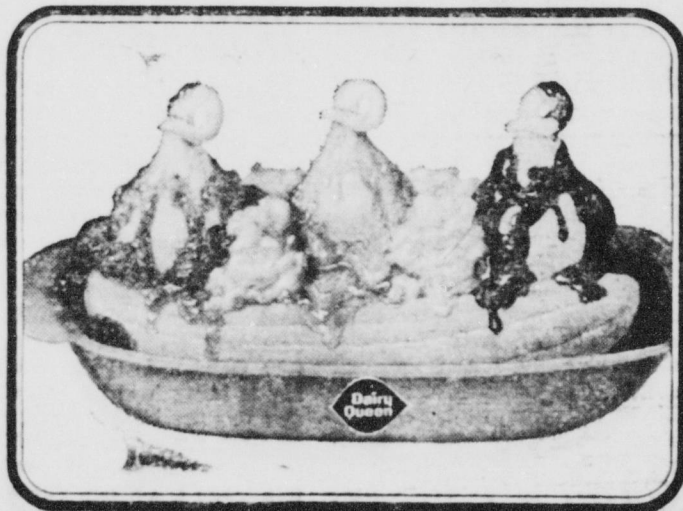
