

Extra Point Is Difference In Shamrock Win

North Liberty's Shamrocks won their second straight football game 14-13 over LaVille on Friday night. It was a come from behind win for the Shamrocks and the final margin was made by the toe of Kevin Hostetter. This boosts the overall record of the Shamrocks to 2-4-1 and leaves the Shamrocks 1-2 in the Northern State Conference.

LaVille scored in the game as their running star, Dale Cramer, carried the ball in from nine yards out. Vic Thacker kicked the extra point and the Lancers had a 7-0 lead. This came in the second quarter and the score remained this way through the rest of the half.

The second half was a different story. The Shamrocks gained possession in the third period on a pass interception by Wes Peterson. Kevin Hostetter then put on a one-man show as his play was continually called. He carried eight straight times and finally went in for the score from one yard out. He then kicked the extra point and this tied the game at 7-7 in the third period.

LaVille went ahead once again as Gary Rowe carried the ball in after a sustained drive. The touchdown play was one yard. The all-important try for the extra point was then blocked by Jim Plunkett and the host team held a 13-7 lead with time becoming a real factor.

Following the kickoff, Wesolek hit fullback Hostetter with a pass in the flat on which Hostetter rambled for 50 yards before being brought down. This put the ball on the Lancer nine yard line. Four plays later, Wesolek faked an off tackle play and slipped outside his own right end and went the final two yards

for the score. Hostetter then pushed the Shamrock ahead for the first time, 14-13 with his conversion.

Wes Peterson and Gary Smith led the usually stout North Liberty defense with 27 and 29 tackling points respectively. Once again the pass interception was a big part of the defense as the Shamrock defenders picked off four LaVille passes to raise their season total to 17 interceptions.

Falcons Fall To South Central 31-14 Friday

The South Central Satellites handed the John Glenn Falcons their third defeat of the season Friday night using an asset that can cause the most harm to the Falcons, that being speed. Using a lot of wide runs with a very good quarterback option, the South Central team kept the defense honest enough to penetrate almost at will early in the game. The loss makes record 3-3-1 this year.

The Falcons lost the toss of the coin and kicked to South Central. It didn't take the host team to move 60 yards for first score as they covered the distance in just 11 plays, three times making key third down plays for first downs. With just less than half the quarter gone, Dennis Yagelski ran the final yard for the score. The Satellites missed their extra point try and led 6-0 over the Glenn team.

The second touchdown came also in the first period as Glenn was unable to control the ball. South Central took over on their own 43 yard line and this time it took just four plays before Chuck Eaton got free and jipped 44 yards for the second score with just 21 seconds left in the period. Again the try for point was missed and the Falcons were then on the short end of a 12-0 score.

South Central continued their dominance as the third time they got the ball it was on a blocked

kick and moved 56 yards in 15 plays. This time it was Jerry Bennett moving in from one yard out after the Falcons almost made an outstanding goal line stand. South Central had made down on the Falcons one and it took four plays before they barely made it into the end zone. Once more the point after failed, this time on a pass, making it 4:26 left in the first half.

Things did change at this point. The Falcons took the kick off and after a 26 yard return by Larry Neiswender, the Falcons were first and 10 on their own 39. Larry Groves sparked the drive with his running and finally he pounded over from seven yards out, giving the Falcons a score with 1:50 showing on the clock. Steve Ludwig ran the extra point and it was 18-7, with the Falcons showing some life after another bad start.

The Falcons received the second half kick and after gaining one first down, quarterback Craig DeMyer was smeared attempting to pass and umbled. The Satellites covered the loose ball with Roger Bishop making the big save. It not only stopped the drive that could have made the game close had Glenn been successful on this drive, but kept the ball deep in Falcon territory. After another exchange of the ball, South Central moved 43 yards on one wide play to score first in the second half. Denny Yagelski covered this distance and with another missed extra point, it was 24-7.

In the final period the LaPorte County team scored again, this time on a two yard run by Matt Yagelski. This time a pass was completed for the extra point for a 31-7 lead. Glenn then marched all the way down field after the kick making a fast sustained drive of 71 yards in just five plays, four completed passes by DeMyer. Ludwig caught the big one for the final 17 yards and the score and on the extra point it was DeMyer teaming up with Steve Buswell. This made the score 31-14 which eventually ended as the final tally of the night.

Part of Glenn's shortcomings this game were by their own doing. Twice they lost fumbles to the Satellites and on another occasion an intercepted pass stopped a potential drive.
