Blind Pilot — Ambrose Clancy. A powerful, exciting and fearless look at Ireland and its continuing struggle to be free.

Rivergate House — Elissa Grandower. In an attempt to obtain control of the family fortune, the unscrupulous younger son murders his father and plants evidence that he hopes will lead an attractive private investigator to suspect his older brother.

The Covenant — James Michener. A major novel about South Africa — its people, real and imaginary, caught up in the march of world history — a history of adventure and heroism.

Agnes Nixon's All My Children — Rosemarie Santine. Amid the emotional turmoils and dramatic intrigues of life in the small town of Pine Valley, Tara Martin and Philip Brent struggle to hold on to their love despite the terrible secret that threatens to destroy it.

The Unborn — David Shubin. A tale that gets to the very root of our fears about computer intelligence and the technological manipulation of mankind.

The Visitors — Clifford Simak. One of the most original concepts of alien contact yet in a multilevel novel of human intelligence and emotion in a close encounter with truly non-human beings.

Gospel Fever — Frank G. Slaughter. Brother Tim Bishop, a charismatic, deeply religious television evangelist, must deal with trying personal problems and the petty jealousies of other media ministers in order for his own ministry to survive.

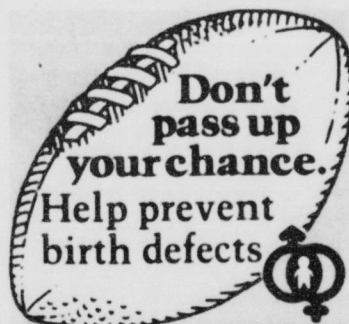

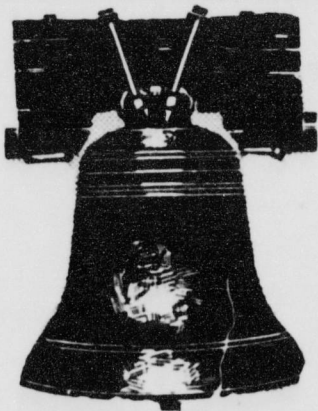
