

Falcons Win

which he gathered in and beat the defender to apparently go all the way only to have that yellow flag lying on the field about the 30 yard line and Tinkey was called for offensive interference. It was then second and 14 from the four, when another penalty for encroachment made it second and 16 from the 2. However, a pass to Tinkey again was good and this 32 yard play got the Falcons out of a hole and gave them a much needed first down. A drive continued from this point that covered 11 plays and a total of 92 yards (98 with penalties) and Mike Elkin scored from 15 yards out to make it 13-6. Phelps was wide with the kick and it remained this way until the last play of the half.

South Central was unable to move the ball in two possessions but Glenn, after getting down to the Satellites 42 yard line late in the half, had a Fansler pass intercepted by Tom Utroske at the South Central 18. Two running plays netted only two yards and on a key third down play with time about out, Rod Lowry intercepted a Kevin Yagelski pass and returned it to the South Central 15 where with :05 showing coach John Hostrawser sent in his field goal unit. Tinkey snared a high snap, but got it down and Phelps easily put the ball through from 32 yards out and the halftime score was 16-6.

The second half was all Glenn. Getting the ball at their own 31 after the kickoff, it took just 5 running plays and one face mask penalty before Elkin plowed over from 8 yards out. He had runs of 17, 12 and 8 in this drive while Jeff O'Connor, a really marked man in the first half, added 11 and 6 yards in two carries. Phelps missed the

point after but it was 22-6.

South Central again was stopped cold by the Falcon defense other than a 15 yard penalty and Glenn got the ball back in short order. This time a 67 yard drive in 6 plays found O'Connor getting the last 30 yards for a score with 3:14 yet to play in the third quarter. Kelly Cordell then kicked the extra point to make it 29-6.

After the kickoff, three plays and punt for S.C. and it was O'Connor's turn again. On the first play the speedy senior back found a hole right up the middle behind some fine blocking and got in the secondary to set up the foot race he was going to win. It was 66 yards in all and the Falcons' third touchdown in the third quarter. Cordell kicked the point once again and it was now a commanding 36-6.

The last score of the game came late in the contest with the reserves getting a lot of playing time Bill West found a lot of daylight on a pitchout from freshman quarterback Mark Cain as he raced 38 yards untouched into the end zone for the final score of the night.

Coach Hostrawser used all his boys in this game and they all responded with some hard play. It was another big night for O'Connor after a rather "slow" first half of only 54 yards in 15 carries, but the two big scoring runs of 30 and 66 gave him a total of 175 in 21 carries for the night. Fansler also did a fine job of passing with five out of nine for 89 yards with one intercepted. Tinkey caught four of Fansler's completions for 76 yards and also ran the ball from his wingback position 5 times for 42 yards.

HILER FUND RAISING DINNER NOV. 8

Delbert Latta, of Ohio, ranking Republican on the House Budget Committee, will keynote the dinner at the Century Center in South Bend.

Three Republican leaders of the House of Representatives largely responsible for successful passage of President Reagan's program for economic recovery will keynote a second-annual fundraising dinner for Third District Congressman John Hiler.

House Republican Leader Bob Michel, of Illinois, and Reps. Delbert Latta, of Ohio, and Barber Conable, of New York, ranking Republicans on the Budget and tax-writing Ways and Means committees, respectively, will stump for Hiler at the November 8th event at the Century Center in South Bend.

"These are the men responsible for House passage of the long overdue budget and tax cuts that are now law," said Hiler, a first-term Republican from LaPorte. "Without their able leadership, we

would not have begun the process of restoring fiscal sanity to government and granting greater economic independence to working Americans."

Ed Simcox, Indiana Secretary of State, will be master of ceremonies for the 7:00 p.m. event. Tickets are being sold by the Hiler for Congress Committee and GOP county officials in the third district for \$30 per person. Northern Indiana GOP county chairmen will be sponsoring a reception prior to the dinner.

Michel, of Peoria, was elected in 1956 and is serving his first year as Republican Leader. Conable was elected in 1964, and also serves as ranking Republican member of the Joint Committee on Taxation. Latta, elected in 1958, represents Ohio's Fifth District, which neighbors east Indiana.
