LEGISLATURE IN SESSION

The 1986 short session of the Indiana Legislature re-convened Tuesday and despite the original meaning of the short session, this 30 day meeting of Indiana's lawmakers has some very important issues facing them.

Always an issue is funding for education. This will once again be a much discussed topic, but the ability to find more money in this short session is something else. The budget is set in the long sessions, and the real purpose of the short term session was to adjust to any matters that were necessary due to setting a budget two years in advance.

The license branch situation will again be a main topic. The public has shown that some type of change or control must be instigated and now the proposals are plentiful and different. The Senate is trying to push the responsibility on the House in this matter, claiming they had a plan at the end of last session that was not accepted by the House. In the meantime, Gov. Orr has insisted that license branch reform take place and has offered his suggestions as to how this should happen. The House did have a committee investigating and working on this the past year and only time will tell just what will be done along this line.

Liability insurance for municipalities and other agencies is a major problem in Indiana as well as everywhere. It looks like a "cap" is a must in liability claims as over the years the many court cases, counter suits, settlement other than in court, etc., has forced the liability insurance to astronomical levels, making it impossible for some to even find it or be able to take it out. There is no doubt this has gotten completely out of hand in a "sue-happy" world we live in.

There are many other matters to be covered in bills introduced, too numerous to mention, but you are still represented in both houses by men who are willing and anxious to listen to your personal feelings. They are your voice, and unless you let them know your feelings, they cannot speak for you. Don't be afraid to voice your opinion, both pro and con on any matter that is of importance to you.

There is no denying the job of the Indiana, as well as other state legislators, is going to become much more difficult. The more the federal government talks about cutting back to balance the budget, etc., the more responsibilities that will be handed right back to the states. Their job will certainly become more complex as time continues as they will be forced to shoulder the burden of many programs now handled by those in Washington. These legislators do have a very important job, both now and in the future. They are your voice, don't be afraid to use it.
