PURDUE MEDALS TO GO TO INDIVIDUAL STARS

CITY ALUMNI TO ENCOURAGE HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL BY AWARDS.

An all-Indianapolis High School football team to consist of eleven regulars and four substitutes will be chosen each year under auspices of the Purdue University Alumni Association of the city, and each year the top two players on the team will receive what is to be called the Purdue medal. Steps for such action have been taken by the Purdue Alumni Association in order to encourage playing of football in Indianapolis, and the plan has received the consent of the officials at each of the high schools.

This all-Indianapolis team will be chosen with the following points in mind:

1. Natural ability as a football player.

2. The season's record of the player as a member of the team to which he belongs.

3. The willingness and ability of the player to work for the welfare of the team even at the cost of individual success.

The substitutes may be chosen similarly, but the Purdue medal or because it is considered that the selection of some one player for a given position can not be made without the up-and-downs of the plan whose record entitles him to equal reward.

Makeup of Committee.

The above team shall be chosen as soon as possible after the close of the football season by a committee to be made up as follows:

The chairman of the committee, who shall preside over the committee, shall be entitled to a vote, shall be the president of the Purdue Alumni Association of Indianapolis.

The high school shall be represented by the manager of the football team and by one other representative of the school.

Each of the three leading daily papers, The Indianapolis Star and the Indianapolis News, and the Indianapolis Journal, shall be entitled to a vote, shall be the sporting editor or his representative.

The committees shall make such additional rules and regulations for its guidance as may be necessary.
