

INDICTED FOR MURDER.

Lake County Grand Jury Acts in Case of Three Colored Men.
(Special to The Indianapolis News)
GARY, Ind., October 14.—The Lake county grand jury at Crown Point returned indictments of murder in the first degree Wednesday against three negroes, Christopher Carter, held since September 13 for the murder of James Cook, colored editor of the Defender and Sun, was held without bail, Jesse Evans, at whose home Carter took refuge, following the shooting, was held as an accessory, his bail being fixed at \$7,500.
In addition to Carter, Allen Rogers, charged with killing Charlotte Mitchell here on September 9, and George Wright, alleged slayer of Harvey Mallory August 14, were also indicted and held without bail. Three East Chicago prisoners held as participants in a shooting affray here, George Chopin, Frank Strano and Francisco Huerra, were released for lack of sufficient evidence.

DISCUSS BUTLER EXPANSION

Directors Realize Speed Is Necessary—673 Students Enrolled.
The question of selecting a new site for Butler College and expansion of the college to care for an increased enrollment was considered by the board of directors Wednesday afternoon.
James W. Putnam, dean of the college, reported that there are 673 students enrolled. This is an increase over last year of about 35 per cent. Members of the board said the steadily increasing enrollment makes it necessary to work out an expansion program speedily. The board formally accepted the resignation of President Thomas Carr Howe. Dr. Howe's resignation was accepted by the executive committee of the board and took effect September 1. A committee was appointed to express the board's regret at Dr. Howe's resignation and its appreciation of his services. On the committee were Dr. A. B. Philpott and Scott Butler, of Indianapolis, and James L. Clark, of Danville.

LARGE SALARIES INDICATED

Jesse E. Eschbach Gives Figures at Kiwanis Club Luncheon.
Figures indicating that abnormal salaries are paid to officers of some mining companies and that abnormal profits have been taken were read before the Kiwanis Club at its luncheon at the Hotel Severin Wednesday by Jesse Eschbach, chairman of the state food and fuel commission in support of the assertion that the commission has been fair in fixing prices for coal. The speaker said that some Indianapolis retail coal dealers had told him the price fixed for retailers is fair and pleaded with him to get coal from the mines.
One mining company, said Mr. Eschbach, with a capitalization of \$10,000 has been paying salaries as high as \$24,000 a year and yet has been mining coal at a cost lower than that fixed by the commission. Another company, with a capitalization of \$10,000, he said, had been making a net profit of \$2,700 a month, while still another company, capitalized at \$1,500,000, could make an annual profit of \$1,500,000 on the prices fixed by the commission should they mine the amount of coal they have reported they could mine. Gold Star Mother Lost Two Sons in War.
NEW YORK, October 14.—Democratic national headquarters made public a letter from Mrs. Marie A. Davidson, of Elizabeth, N. J., a "gold star mother," inciting a "widow's mite" for "diminution of truth about the league of nations."
Mrs. Davidson, who sent to war four sons, two of whom were killed, expressed sympathy with "an honest and concerted effort by the nations of the earth to save, if possible, future mothers and sons from these sacrifices."

MUSSERS PLEAD GUILTY.

Father and Son Sentenced for Liquor Law Violations.

MARTINSVILLE, Ind., Oct. 14.—John W. Musser and son, Samuel Musser, pleaded guilty in circuit court yesterday to violations of liquor laws. The elder Musser was fined \$150 and his son \$100 by Judge Bain. The son also was sentenced to the State Farm for four months.
The Mussers were arrested September 8 when federal officers raided their home in Green township and captured a still and some liquor. Federal officers said they were satisfied with the judgment of the court.
Samuel Musser will face a federal court indictment under the Reed amendment for bringing liquor into the state from Dayton, O., when he serves his sentence.
