Traction Line Seeks Higher Fare Within City Limits.

The Terre Haute, Indiana & Eastern Traction Company petitioned the public service commission late Wednesday for authority to charge 3 cents a mile, with a 10-cent minimum within the city limits of Indianapolis. The present fare is 5 cents between any two points in the city limits.

PREDICT NO COAL SHORTAGE

National Association Leaders Say All Demands Can Be Met.

NEW YORK, October 14.—There will be no serious bituminous coal shortage in any part of the country this winter, if ordinary care is exercised by consumers, it was predicted here at a conference of the National Coal Association which comprises two-thirds of the bituminous coal producers of the United States. The coal operators, however, said that in

order to keep the markets supplied steady work at the mines and a sufficient supply of railroad cars also would be required. At this time, it was said, bituminous operators were getting only about 35 to 36 per cent of the open top cars needed.

A special committee which has been working with various co-operative agencies to prevent a winter fuel

shortage reported that the interstate commerce commission, railroads, big coal dealers and others were co-operating to increase production and improve transportation and distribution facilities.

In order that the northwest may be protected, an emergency order, similar to that provided for New England deliveries last year, has been applied

it was made known at the conference. The most serious shortage now is in the middle west, the operators said, but domestic consumers, through a systematic distribution, are getting enough coal to meet their needs.

The committee's report said that by an order of the interstate commerce commission \$8,000 coal cars being used for transportation of autos, sand,

gravel and other commodities had been released last Friday for transportation of coal. With these cars, it was said, the railroads will supply sufficient cars to handle 13,000,000 tons of coal a week.

The Wholesale Coal Trade Association announced that the Tidewater Coal Exchange constituted by the government as a war measure to op-

erate a pooling system, was to be continued as a permanent organization.
