

DECLARES NEW IS PARANOIAIC

Alienist Says He Is Surprised
That Girl Slain Did Not
Find Him Out.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Jan. 5.—Harry S. New's mental condition was the subject of further detailed testimony Saturday.

Dr. E. B. Hoag of Pasadena, medical expert and special lecturer for the University of California, analyzed New's case as follows:

"New is constitutionally an inferior person; is of a psychopathic personality; a paranoiac; affected from dementia praecox; feeble-minded and insane."

He based his testimony on an examination of New, a study of New's history and of the evidence and depositions presented at the trial.

It was learned the prosecution will not deny the allegation that New is of an inferior mind, but will attempt to prove he is not dumb and not demented.

Freida Lesser must have been a remarkable girl not to have realized New's mentality, Dr. Hoag declared. New had a theoretical knowledge of right and wrong up to his standard of intellect.

He agreed with Dr. Ross Moore, who testified yesterday that New's mentality was that of a boy slightly under 12 years of age.

Victim of Collision Sues for \$10,000

Damages of \$10,000 were asked Saturday in a suit filed by William Tunnell against the Taggart Baking Company in the superior court, room 4, for alleged injuries sustained when an automobile of the baking company collided with his motorcycle. The accident happened April 19, 1916.

Building Permits Total \$12,794,550

Building operations in Indianapolis during 1919 totaled \$12,794,550 in value, according to complete figures compiled today by C. C. Miller, chief clerk of the building commissioner's office. This is an increase over 1918 of more than 300 per cent, and of \$3,699,645 over 1913, the largest previous year. The total valuation of new building in 1918 was a little over \$4,000,000.
