STOCK MARKET

STILL HEAVY

Opening Trend Is Lower and

Call Rate Checks Rally.

NEW YORK, Feb. 25.—Prices were

again under pressure at the opening of

the stock market today, losses of from

fractions to over 4 points being sustained

in all the active issues.

Steel common sold off 1/4 to 3/4. Re-

public steel was in supply, falling 4

points to 93 1/4. Crude oil dropped 3/4 to

10 1/2, and Baldwin Locomotive 1 1/2 to

10 1/2.

Southern Pacific dropped 3/4 to 35 1/4,

and Rock Island sustained an equal loss

at 33 1/2. Baltimore and Ohio yielded 1 1/2

to 32 1/2. Canadian Pacific 3/4 to 120 1/4.

Mexican Petroleum was under pres-

sure, dropping 3 points to 103. Pan-

American Petroleum fell 2 1/2 to 120 1/4.

General Motors was 2 1/2 lower at 233,

and Chrysler Motors dropped 3 1/2 to 121.

United States Rubber lost 1 1/2 to 95.

Atlantic Gulf 3/4 to 142, and American

Woolen 2 1/2 to 120 1/2.

The pressure against the market at

the start was followed by firmness in

many issues, some of which regained

their opening losses, but the general

movement was one of an opening call money

rate of 7 per cent, an opening selling move

of 1/4, and a general decline in prices

of 1/2 to 3/4. The railroad issues were the

strongest, Rock Island advancing to 34 1/2

and New Haven to 34 1/4.

Steel common, after falling to 93 1/4,

dropped to 92 1/4. Mexican Petroleum re-

covered to 103, and Pan-American Pe-

troleum to 120 1/4. The stock market

was low to 10. General Motors, after

selling down to 231 1/2, rose to 233 and

then broke again to 232.
