Turners and Anderson Replace Montgomery County Fives in Meet Here.

FIRST GAMES FRIDAY

With the withdrawal from the state 150 pound independent basketball tournament of the Crawfordsville and Wingate high school teams, the meet at the local Y. M. C. A. Friday and Saturday becomes an official event for the independent teams, and every basket ball club that has entered the withdrawal of the Montgomery county fives as a good thing for the meet. Both Crawfordsville and Wingate are "outlaw" high school basket ball teams this season, due to their suspension from the Indiana High School Athletic association and the fact that they were to compete among the independent amateur was not received with favor by a number of followers of the game.

Crawfordsville and Wingate both withdrew rather late, but Wayne Emmanuel, manager of the tourney, has replaced these fives with the Semi State Fivers of the city, and the strong Anderson Y. M. C. A. quintet, with both popular organizations. The reason given for the withdrawal of the Montgomery county fives is that the players of those teams were out of condition as a result of participation in the strenuous meet at Cincinnati last week. Therefore, after looking over the state amateur teams and their records, Emmanuel picked the Anderson Y. M. C. A. quintet to take the place of Wingate in the tournament, and the semi state fives in the tourney by the withdrawal of the Crawfordsville club.

NEW SQUADS HAVE RECORDS.

The fans owe Emmanuel a bit of pleasure for the judgment he used in picking teams to take the places of the Montgomery county quintets on the schedule. They both bear remarkable records and will surely keep the standards of play high.
