

CAR PROBLEMS LIKE THOSE IN OTHER CITIES

Louisville, Cincinnati, Cleveland and Detroit Demanding Better Service.

CO-OPERATION IS TRIED

Indianapolis is not the only city with street car trouble.

Nearly every city in the middle west is in the same situation as Indianapolis. Numerous remedies are proposed.

In Louisville, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Detroit and other places, complaints are made of poor service. Street car officials, in nearly every case, reply that they are up against a difficult financial situation. In some cities fares have been increased to 6 or 7 cents.

OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES CO-OPERATE.

In Louisville six representatives of the street car employees have been named with six officials of the company to perfect a co-operative welfare association for betterment of mutual interests and improvement of the service.

In Cincinnati people are making many suggestions for the improvement of street car service. One of the suggestions is that a pay-as-you-leave system be installed on the cars instead of a pay-as-you-enter. This is proposed as a method of speeding up loading and unloading of cars. Re-routing of cars on several lines also is being considered.

Detroit is aroused over a proposal by Mayor Coughlin that the city begin the operation of a municipally-owned street car system. It is reported in Detroit that the street car company is planning many improvements in service to counteract this proposal.

HEAVY OF DETROIT GREATLY CONGESTED.

Street car congestion in the center of the city is declared to be the worst feature of Detroit's street car system.

A commission is drafting a new street car franchise for Toledo, which found itself without service last summer when the company moved all cars out of the city. Henry L. Doherty, traction magnate, has disagreed with the findings of the service-at-cost commission of Toledo, and has offered to pay the expenses of a special election, to be held

LADY ASTOR IN FIGHT TO DRY UP ENGLAND

Believes Restriction First Step to Accomplish Reform Like America's.

WOULD MOVE SLOWLY

LONDON, March 12.—William (Pussy-foot) Johnson is in danger of being overshadowed in the fight to make Great Britain dry by Viscountess Astor, despite his spectacular entry into the fray.

Viscountess Astor, who already has opened her campaign in parliament, is determined to see the battle through to a finish, although her aims are less drastic than those of the extremist faction led by Johnson.

In outlining her attitude today she declared that she is not a prohibitionist in the strict sense of the word. While she wants to see the British Isles "bone dry" she believes that restriction and control of the drink question should be the first step in the gradual reform that would eventually end in prohibition such as the United States has at present.

TRYING TO MAKE PEOPLE HAPPY.

The American-born viscountess takes a practical view of the temperance struggle. She declares that she is not a "woman with a mission," but merely trying to "do her bit" to make the people happier.

"While the whole world is apparently going to the dogs, I think that England today is not quite ready for it," declared Viscountess Astor. "Prohibitionists want a whole apple or none. I will accept half an apple or even a quarter of one."

"I fail to see where intoxicating liquor has done any good if this world. I believe that its effects should be minimized as much as possible, and its use restricted."

"The important thing is to protect the coming generation from drink. No father wants his children to fall under the influence of alcohol. There is another feature: The working men must have some recreation other than the degrading bestiality of

STATE OPERATION

"ONLY SOLUTION."

"When they are operated by the state public houses must be made to provide good food, tea, coffee and cocoa and push the sale of these as well as beer and whisky. Public house owners now aim to fill up the customer with liquor to the point of intoxication."

"The breweries and public houses can be obtained only by purchase. The British love of fair play would not permit of confiscation. The voters, I believe, should have submitted to them, by districts, three choices: (a) continuation of the liquor business, as at present; (b) state ownership and control; (c) prohibition."

"When the truth dawns upon the workingman he is going to demand changes so as to help create a better England. He is not going to be the alcoholic bully who deprives his own offspring of possible advantages. Personally, I do not wish to prohibit any person from having his glass of beer. But I am deeply interested in arousing this nation to its manifest duty of cleansing itself of John Bull's worst-features and heritages."
