

MARION COUNTY
IN BRIDGE LISTWill Get Two Out of Fourteen
Awarded March 30.

Contracts for fourteen bridges, all but two of more than twenty-foot spans, will be awarded March 30 by the state highway commission. Estimated cost of the program is \$150,000. William J. Titus, chief engineer of the bridge department, said today.

Two of the bridges will be built in Marion county at a combined cost of \$20,837. Other counties to get state highway bridges include Elkhart, St. Joseph, Putnam, Vigo, Clay, Johnson, Marshall, Jackson, Hancock, Tipton and Howard.

A dozen additional bridge contracts may be awarded in May in case the commission decides to build bridges on the highway system in advance of letting the road building contracts.

MARCH PROGRAM ON
BRIDGE CONTRACTS.

The March bridge contract program is as follows:

Marion County—Two spans, thirty-two feet each, Madison road near Southport, over Rock creek, steel, \$6,655, concrete, \$5,877; three spans, twenty-five feet each, Madison road, over Lick creek, steel, \$9,025, concrete, \$5,250.

Elkhart County—Thirty-foot span, Lincoln Highway, near Benton, steel, \$5,040; concrete, \$4,774.

Putnam County—Thirty-foot span, National road, over Robards' creek, steel, \$8,390; concrete, \$7,928; fifty-two-foot span, National road, over Sallus creek, steel, \$12,400; concrete, \$13,100.

Vigo County—Twenty spans, twenty feet each, National road, over Snake creek, steel, \$11,220; concrete, \$10,000.

Clay County—Thirty-five foot span, National road, Miller creek, steel, \$6,946; concrete, \$5,955.

Johnson County—Two spans, fifteen feet each, Madison road, ditch repair, \$2,500.

Michigan County—One span, twenty feet, Michigan road, steel only, \$3,000.

St. Joseph County—Two spans, fifty-five feet each, near Osceola, Lincoln Highway, steel, \$14,900; concrete, \$17,150.

Jackson County—Two spans, eighteen feet each, French trail, steel, \$5,200; concrete, \$4,750.

Hancock County—One span, sixty-two feet, National road, over Sugar creek, steel, \$10,237; concrete, \$9,600.

Tippecanoe County—Thirty-foot span, Range Line road, over ditch, steel, \$6,512; concrete, \$6,200.

Howard County—One span, forty feet, Range Line road, steel, \$6,465; concrete, \$5,831.
