SUCCESSOR TO
TAGGART—HOW?

the public press that the state central
committee should nominate a democratic
candidate for United States senator, be-
cause Thomas Taggart has said he
was nominated. After a letter he wrote
to the secretary of state, I beg to submit
that the primary election law im-
plies these functions, six:

"1. To select the committee and
delegates essential to party organization.

"2. To nominate candidates for cer-
tain offices to be elected by the people.

"3. To nominate candidates for national
conventions whose duty it is, under the law, to make exposition of party
policies and to nominate party candi-
dates for the offices (1) of president; (2)
of vice president; (3) of United States
senator; (4) of governor.

The law throughout is arranged accord-
ing to the distinction which exists between
the two classes of public
functions, viz.: (1) Those for which nomi-
nations shall be made at the primary
election, and (2) those for which nomi-
nations shall be made at state or na-
tional conventions, as the case may be,
by the respective parties, either by in-
structed or un instructed delegates.

The vigorous advances at the opening
