



MILLION DAILY IN GOLD GOING FROM AMERICA

Exports of Precious Metal Far Exceed Record Marks Set Last Year.

ARGENTINA GETS THIRD

WASHINGTON, March 18.—The outflow of American gold to foreign capitals now exceeds \$1,000,000 a day, reports to the treasury indicated today.

Gold exports at this rate, far exceed record marks established last year, and heavier demands, calling for still larger shipments, indicate exports may overtop the present high total.

Federal reserve board officials now estimate that gold exports for 1920 may reach \$400,000,000.

ONE-THIRD GOES TO ARGENTINA

Tabulations on shipment of the precious metal abroad show that South America gets the larger share. Practically one-third of the gold shipped since Jan. 1 has gone to consignees in Argentina. Almost equally large shipments went to China and Japan.

The heavy drain upon the American gold supply is but slightly offset by imports. Imports scarcely amount to one-eighth of exports.

Federal reserve board officials saw no occasion for alarm in the steadily maintained heavy export record. Officials pointed to latest figures showing total gold assets of the United States, both in gold coin and bullion, amount to \$2,104,000,000. This is made up of \$435,000,000 gold coin and \$1,729,000,000 in gold bullion.

LIABILITIES IN NATION'S GOLD COLUMN.

As against the great gold supply still available there are listed in Uncle Sam's liabilities column gold certificates outstanding amounting to \$594,000,000. The gold certificates totals \$1,104,000,000. Gold reserve amounts to \$152,000,000. There remains \$223,426,000 available gold in the general fund.

Settle 3-Year-Old Suit Against City

Richard Baker has dismissed his suit for damages, filed three years ago in one of the superior courts against the city of Indianapolis for damages sustained when playing baseball in Garfield park. The power court awarded damages to the extent of \$200,000. Baker, but the appellate court reversed the decision and sent the case back for trial. It is announced that a satisfactory settlement has been made out of court.
