

JOINING PHONES TO BEGIN SOON

Engineers of Merging Companies Await Order.

Engineers of the Central Union Telephone company today were considering preliminary problems connected with the consolidation of the Indianapolis Telephone company with the Central Union system in compliance with the court order, affirmed yesterday by the supreme court of Indiana.

Definite steps to carry out the merger contract today awaited final advice of attorneys of the Central Union Telephone company. The company has waived its right to appeal to the supreme court for a rehearing of the suit no doubt remains that the merger will be effected. Lawyers will advise company officials what method of procedure to follow.

Inasmuch as the company has waived details will be consummated within a few weeks, it is said, but a much longer time will be required to "cut over" the subscribers of the automatic (Indianapolis Company) system to the Bell system. A year may be required to complete the physical adjustment, officials of the Central Union said today.

When an automatic subscriber is switched to the Bell system he will be able to reach by "phone all the telephone subscribers in the city. In order to get a connection with a Central Union phone he will have to dial a number

and then call the number of the objective "phone to the manual operator. To reach other automatic subscribers he will dial numbers in the usual way.
