

## LEGION WOMEN TO ORGANIZE INDIANA UNITS

Adjutant Newgent Notifies All  
Posts of Auxiliary Move-  
ment.

12 CHARTERS ARE ASKED

With applications for the formation of twelve American legion women's auxiliary units approved, L. Russell Newgent, state adjutant of the American legion, today sent out instructions to every post in the state urging the immediate organization of auxiliary units. Bylaws for the auxiliaries have been approved by the national executive committee and membership buttons to be worn by the women have been provided.

The twelve posts that have applied for charters for auxiliaries are: Cass county post No. 60, Logansport; Robert E. Kennington post No. 34, Thomas P. Ryan post No. 116; Bruce P. Robinson post No. 133; St. Michael post No. 148, Raymond E. Templeton post No. 150, and the Marine River post No. 61, Indianapolis; Victory post No. 70, Shelbyville; Dewey Bliga post No. 29, Rensselaer; Gary Memorial post No. 17; Lewis Monroe post No. 53, Ellettsville, and Zionsville post No. 79, Zionsville.

**LARGE ENROLLMENTS ARE LOOKED FOR.**  
The Logansport post informed Mr. Newgent that it expects to have a membership of 900 in the auxiliary and the Gary post will have an enrollment of between 300 and 400.

The national and state officials of the legion have been working out plans for the formation of auxiliaries ever since they were authorized by the Minneapolis convention. Many posts in the state

have organized temporary units and these are now expected to apply for charters. Under the bylaws, membership is limited to mothers, wives, daughters and sisters of the members of the American legion and to similar relatives of men or women who died in service during the period of the war. The officers of each post will consist of a president, vice president, secretary and treasurer with an executive committee of at least three members.

shall have independent action. Applications for charters must be approved by the post of which it is a unit. The charters will be issued by the national legion organization after having been endorsed by the department commander. Ten women may organize a unit.

The emblem adopted is similar in design to the American legion button, with the exception that in the center on a white field is a blue star, or a gold star for those who lost a relative in the war. On the purple band encircling the star are the words, "American Legion Women's Auxiliary." The emblem will be handled entirely from the national headquarters and will be issued on application for a charter.

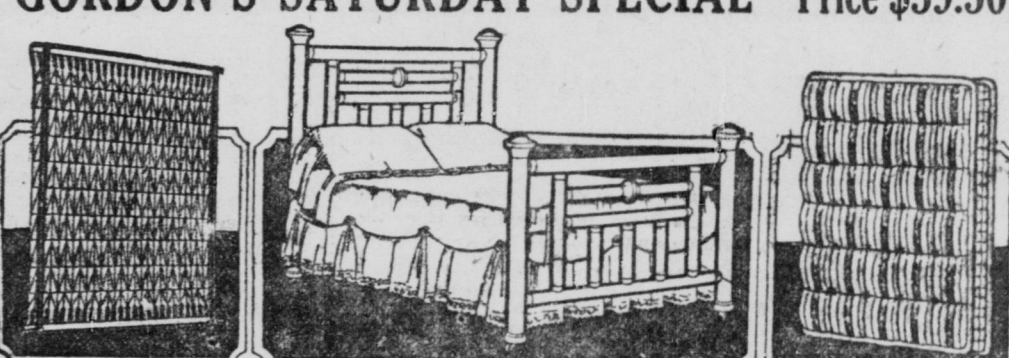

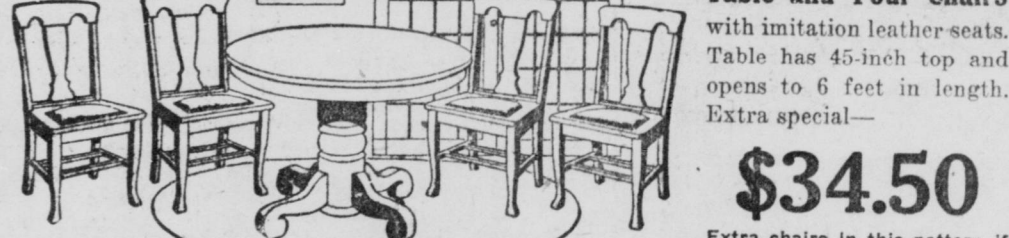
