A discussion on the subject of arbitrary increases in price of goods by manufacturers and jobbers after orders have been placed will be led by W. W. Hammond of the firm of Jones, Hammond & Jones.

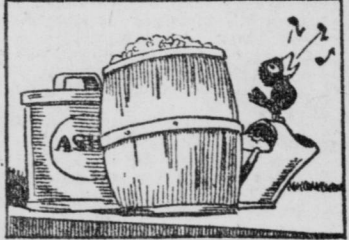

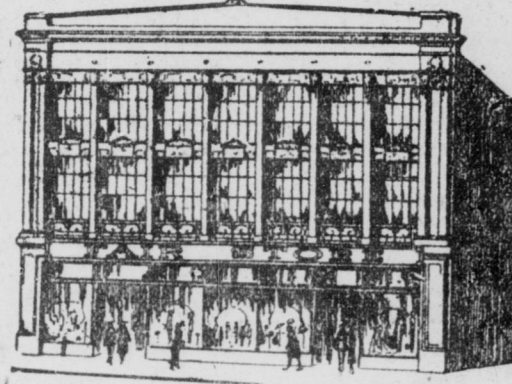
