CITY OF 153,830Census Reports Show Gain of
37,253, or 31.1 Per Cent.

WASHINGTON, March 24.—Preliminary population figures were announced today by the census bureau as follows:

Dayton, O., 1920 population, 153,830; increase, 37,253, or 31.1 per cent; 1910 population, 116,577.

Warren, O., 1920 population, 27,050; increase, 15,969, or 14.1 per cent; 1910 population, 21,051.

Knox, O., 1920 population, 16,026; increase, 6,719, or 72.2 per cent; 1910 population, 9,307.

Parkersburg, W. Va., 1920 population, 20,039; increase, 2,197, or 12.3 per cent; 1910 population, 17,812.

Clifton Forge, Va., 1920 population, 6,150; increase, 402, or 7.0 per cent; 1910 population, 5,748.

Sikeston, Mo., 1920 population, 3,575; increase, 248, or 7.3 per cent; 1910 population, 3,327.


FIGHT IN EVERY NAME.


