the good nature of the school board members for approval of it.

Contractors who have looked over the buildings now in process of demolition do not hesitate to say that thousands of dollars might have been saved the school city by offering these buildings for sale as they stood.

SAVING OF MONEY NOBODY'S BUSINESS.

However, the saving of money in connection with school city expenditures is not a matter that is the specific duty of any one person and as a result it does not appear to enter into the business of the school board as it is now conducted.

Eventually, it is presumed, that school houses will be erected on the sites that are now being cleared, but there is no indication that this will be done in the immediate future.

Instead of making use of the houses which were used as dwellings before the school board purchased them until con-

tracts are underway for the building of new schools, the procedure seems to be to wreck the houses and clear the sites, raise a good crop of weeds on the vacant lots and in the course of time ask the tax board to approve a bond issue on which a contract can be let for the building of a new school a few months later.

As the school city's business is now conducted from six months to two years elapses between the time the site of a

new school building is purchased and the time it is actually used.

In the meanwhile the business director prefers open spaces to income producing dwellings.
