Declare Special Assembly  
Should Take Action.

United States Senator James E. Watson thinks Goodrich's proposed special legislative session should do something to provide for a Hoosier war memorial.

He makes known his desire for such action in answer to an inquiry made by the state war memorial committee of the American Legion.

KALAMAZOO, Mich., March 26.—Mrs. Sarah Tabor has been released from the hospital where she was suffering an attack of heart trouble, it was learned today, and she probably will be taken back to Pawpaw next Tuesday for arraignment and examination for the murder of her daughter, Maude Tabor Virgo, more than four years ago.

A further postponement will be ordered in case Dr. A. S. Warthen of the University

of Michigan is unable to be present at that date.

Dr. Warthen examined Maude Virgo's body and reported death had been produced by an illegal operation during child birth.


