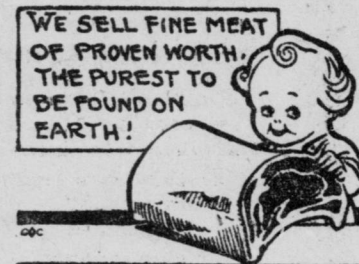
A further postponement will be ordered in case Dr. A. S. Warthen of the University of Michigan is unable to be present on that date.
