

## INDIANS THINK U. S. BLUFFING

Not Worried Over Threat to  
Seize Oil Lands.

PAWHUSKA, Okla., March 26.—(A  
bluff!)

With all due deference to Uncle Sam,  
that is what people in this vitally in-  
terested little half-Indian capital of the  
Osage nation think about the reported  
intention of the government to seize oil  
from Osage Indian lands to insure a  
fuel supply for the navy.

"The navy couldn't use the Osage oil  
for fuel," the Indians say.  
"It isn't suitable.  
"If the government did take it, all it  
could do with it would be to trade it  
for heavier oil, which could be used.  
But if the government can say to the  
big oil companies whose oil it wants,  
"Here, we are not dependent on you  
for oil; we have 50,000 barrels a day

of our own," it would have a good  
club to hold over their prices.  
There is general disbelief here that a  
seizure of lands or oil is likely.  
Anyhow the leases giving any govern-  
ment department the option to buy oil  
specify that the purchase shall be at  
the highest market rate.

## Naval Officer, Ill for 11 Years, Dies

eleven years in the naval hospital as

paralysis, Lieut. Commander Sommes  
Read, former naval aid to Presidents  
Roosevelt and Taft, is dead here today.  
He was 59 years old.

## WOOD UNHURT BY BRAIN OPERATION

Had Large Tumor Removed 10  
Years Ago, Friends Say.

NEW YORK, March 26.—Announce-  
ment has been made by friends of Maj.  
Gen. Leonard Wood that the operation  
by which a large tumor was removed  
from his brain ten years ago, has not  
impaired his physical or mental condi-  
tion.

The announcement was made at a  
meeting of the women's department of  
the Wood campaign committee at the  
home of Mrs. Douglass Robinson, sister  
of the late Col. Theodore Roosevelt.  
Dr. Alexander Lambert, personal friend  
of Wood, who performed the operation,  
as authority for this statement.

It was explained that while Wood was  
governor general of Cuba, he rose sud-  
denly from his desk and struck his  
head on a chandelier.  
A stiffness of the left foot developed.  
Several years later he underwent the  
operation.

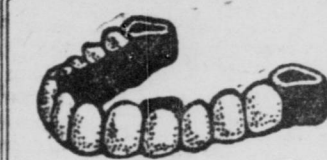
