AS CITY, Mo., April 1.—The
lodge of the Oswego Indians,

000.

and will clear the principal in three
years.

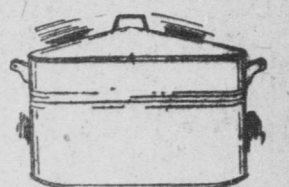
